General

Irrigate copiously with clean water for at least 15 minutes, holding the eyelids apart and seek medical attention.

Skin

Remove contaminated clothing. Wash skin thoroughly with soap and water or use a recognized skin cleanser.

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Ingestion If swallowed obtain immediate medical attention. Keep at rest. Do NOT induce vomiting.

4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Overview Inhalation: Vapors are irritating and may cause chest discomfort and symptoms of bronchitis. Eye Contact: Causes severe chemical burns in eyes. Ingestion: If swallowed, moderately toxic. Will cause burns of the mouth, throat, and stomach with severe pain. Skin Contact: Causes chemical burns on skin. See section 2 for further details.
